TEDrin Talk: Opera 101



People often ask me how I come up with my piano extravaganzas for Grand Night, so I thought I would demystify it for you! First comes the selection itself, for which I have two criteria:

- 1. At least 75% of the audience must be able to recognize the music immediately without the benefit of words;
- 2. The music must translate well to the piano and orchestra, so for example Barry Manilow tunes work better than Jimi Hendrix.

Back when I opened the second act of our show, I didn't feel the same time constraint that I do now that my feature comes in the middle of a one-act format. That makes cogent medleys harder to formulate so I find myself going for extravagant arrangements of single songs more often now, as I will this year! As for the selections themselves, I always feel that Grand Night could use more classic pop/rock, so I frequently go there, but I also like to change it up with humorous novelty (like my Liberace routine or Happy Birthday Variations) or lush, heartfelt romance. You'll have to come to Grand Night to find out which of those three categories I've tapped for my solo this year, but I can assure you of this: it will be over the top and it will be delivered with love for my favorite audience in the world!
